

CLE CREDITS – FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. HOW TO GET THEM:

Sign in on the sheet at the Registration table. Pick up a Certificate of Attendance. When you attend a panel be sure to sign the attendance sheet if one is passed around (if not, then we've already determined that the panel does not qualify for CLE credit). Fill out the JELL Symposium Certificate of Attendance and keep it in your files after the conference.

2. HOW MANY CREDITS HAS MY STATE APPROVED?

None yet. We apply for group approval of credit **after** the conference for Oregon. California and Arizona grant credit as long as Oregon approves credit for the Conference. When Oregon approves the credits we will post them on the Symposium website at <http://www.law.uoregon.edu/org/jell/energy.php>.

3. HOW DO I KNOW WHICH PANELS WILL GET CREDIT?

We don't know yet either. The Symposium will be awarded a fixed amount of general credit, which you can locate at <http://www.osbar.org/members/mclesearch.asp>.

4. WHY WON'T YOU APPLY TO MY STATE FOR CREDIT?

Limited resources means we cannot not apply for credit from every state. However, the process for individually applying for credit is generally listed on each state bar's website. It is usually straightforward as long as you save your certificate of attendance, sign in at all the panels you attend, keep a Symposium program (or access it via our website), and, if your state requires them, save any written materials you receive at panels.

5. DOES JELL KEEP THE SIGN-IN SHEETS?

We do keep the sign-in sheets as per state bar rules. However, we cannot provide attendance certification for past conferences unless dire emergency strikes, so **please** make sure to keep your Certificate of Attendance until you claim credit from your state bar.

6. WILL I HAVE TO PAY FOR CLE CREDIT?

Oregon State Bar members do not need to pay for credit. Also, there is no registration fee for the Symposium. However, bar members from other states will have to refer to their state bar to determine whether or not they will have to pay for CLE credit.
